Recently I have been craving some Japanese snacks and obtained some and during my engorging on them, I was reminded of something that happened to me while I was in Japan: I had the opportunity to visit a Japanese high school with my fellow international classmates. Part of our curriculum was learning about Japanese culture and one of the aspects of any country's culture is the educational system its children go through. When we arrived, everyone was very courteous and after introductions as a group, we broke up into smaller groups: a pair of Japanese students and a pair of international students, each. In line with the Japanese culture, they had brought snacks for us to enjoy together.

It wasn't simply a big bag of chips that everyone was reaching into on every table, but each group had a variety of snacks, both sweet and savory, as well as drinks that we could choose from. This was a unique opportunity to try different kinds of snacks that were popular with the youth in Japan. My mind (and really my stomach) started to formulate how I would be able to taste all the delectable treats and offered to share the bag of crackers that I opened in hopes that the favor would be returned. Of course, as polite as everyone was, there was no issue in sharing our different snacks and I was elated. However, the mood changed as I tried some of my partner's drink.

There was a gasp, and I heard a whisper from across the table say “間接キス!” translated as “indirect kiss!” I asked what this meant, it was explained to me that when you put your lips on something and then another person puts their lips on the same thing, it is as though you kiss indirectly. I thought it was silly at the time and a thing that perhaps only high school students worry about, but because I had remembered this story, I decided to investigate it online. There was a wealth of information on the subject, much more than I would have expected, and much of it was the different kinds of indirect kisses (like between a bottle or a spoon of ice cream) and their implied meanings (because I guess the level of mouth involved implies something else).

But there was an article that got much more philosophical than I could have imagined. It began discussing the reactions that people have to an indirect kiss and stated that you can determine how accustomed you are to interacting with that person, and you can see into the room of that person's mind. I literally had to stop and reread what I had just read. If I am correctly understanding this article, by examining the way we react to indirect kisses we can get a glimpse into who we are as people. I had been so dismissive of the high school students simply being childish, but what more could I have learned if I actually considered what that reaction meant to who they were as a whole person? And what did how I reacted to their reaction say to them? It was a learning moment for myself in the spirit of self-reflection that we so often teach about in Jodo Shinshu. That to be compassionate and aware, we can't simply brush off things that we think we may be better than, whether we are too mature or some other gauge we compare ourselves to other people by. When people react to us, it is an opportunity to get some insight into who they are and learn what that means for both of us.

Governing Board Meeting Highlights - Meeting Date: March 11, 2021

Highlights of BCA National Council Meeting by Peggy Okabayashi: 2022 proposed budget was passed by unanimous consent. Based on BCA membership the dues per member is \$151.18. Florin's monthly assessment will be \$2,116.59 based on an average membership count of 168.

Proposal to provide a discounted BCA membership to anyone under age 30 was presented and passed. Proposal to approve Candidate Affiliate Organization status to the Young Buddhist Editorial was passed.

"Dharma Forward Campaign" was launched to support the growth of BCA and IBS. Campaign to build the future of Buddhism in America.

2022 BCA Ministers Association and National Council Meetings "Strength in Sangha" will be held on March 8-13, 2022 at Doubletree Fresno Convention Center, Fresno, California.

Fundraisers: Sunday, March 7, 2021, BCF held a very profitable "Loco Moco Drive-Thru Breakfast" fundraiser that served 534 orders.

Next scheduled BCF fundraiser will be "Teriyaki, Chicken Plate Drive Thru" Sunday, May 2, 2021.

All affiliates were reminded to comply with the BCF Affiliated Organizations Guidelines. ***First financial report due by April 30, 2021 and to include the bank statement from the last month included in the quarterly report.***

First Vice President, Margie Sunahara: Continues to be responsible for use and security of BCF facilities and grounds. Collects the mail weekly from the US Post Office box.

All affiliates were reminded to comply with the BCF Affiliate Guidelines. A committee chaired by Margie Sunahara will be reviewing each affiliate to determine compliance with the BCF guidelines.

All reports were due on March 1, 2021.

BWA, Peggy Okabayashi: Lady Kujo Memorial Service "Dana Day" project was very successful. Filled 5 barrels with donated food items and collected \$625 in donation for Elk Grove Food Bank and also collected 14 bags of newspapers for SPCA. ***March Dana Projects:*** New socks for homeless for Loaves and Fishes and personal hygiene items for Wellspring Women's Center in Oak Park.

Jr. YBA, Ginny Syphax: February Dana Project the JYBA delivered 25 Valentine's Day goodie bags to Kiero church members. ***JYBA Fundraiser: Udon/Spam Musubi, Sunday April 25, 2021***

Admin Duties, Ginny Syphax: Monitors BCF phones; Emails; FB page; hosts Sangha Check-in; and retrieves the mail from USPO box. Formats and prepares the "Oneness" for publication.

BEC: Sunday, April 11, 2021, Shotsuki and Hanamatsuri Service, Guest Speaker: Rev. Yuki Sugahara.

Facilities Maintenance Kenny Teranishi/Gary Okamoto: With the help of Lloyd Okimura they continue to repair and replace damaged roof panels, parsonage fencing, and stucco on the gym wall caused by the wind storm. Three bids were received to repave the parking lot. Will have two of the contractor's rebid.

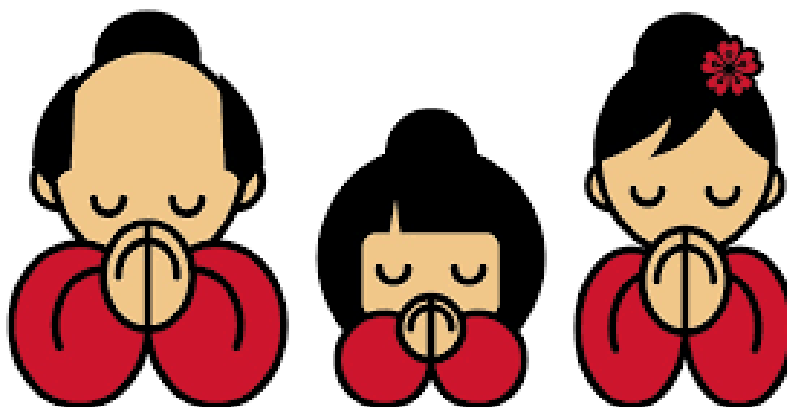
