In March, on the third, Hinamatsuri is celebrated in Japan and those observing Japanese culture. Hinamatsuri literally means “doll festival” but is often translated as Girls’ Day or Dolls’ Day. It’s held on this day because the odd numbers were thought to be auspicious, and with the same odd number, it’s even more special! The dolls were thought to have the ability to take bad spirits with them and so the original festival saw the dolls placed in a river where they would float away along with the participant’s bad luck. Over time, the dolls became more of the centerpiece of the festival and instead of sending them away, the dolls were put up as decoration at home. Initially they were made of paper and straw, but now are made of much more elaborate materials. Still, the ability to take away bad spirits remains with the dolls, so it is imperative that the family take them down when Hinamatsuri is over. The focus has become the girls in the family, hoping for them to grow up healthy.

As with most holidays, there are traditional foods that come along with Hinamatsuri. One of the kinds that I had as a child was Hina Arare. Many of you may be familiar with arare, rice crackers that are made from rice flour. Hina Arare is special in that while arare traditionally does not have any color, Hina Arare is coated with sugar (which makes it sweeter) and is brightly colored for the festival. The colors come in either four or three sets. The four-colored set has pink (representing spring), green (representing summer), yellow (representing fall), and white (representing winter). All together, they represent the wish that parents have for their daughters to have a happy life throughout the year. The three colored is similar in color, but different in meaning in that it contains pink (representing the energy of life), green (representing the energy of trees or nature), and white (representing the energy of the earth). Together, these represent the parents wish for their daughters to have energy and have sound growth.

Of course, it’s wonderful to have a day where we can celebrate all the daughters in our life and wish them happiness as they grow up. But it’s also a great opportunity for us to hope for growth for ourselves, too. No matter what your age is, we all have the ability to grow as people. Sometimes our growth is like the seasons; we have times in our lives that we need a change and something new, or times where we are sad and unhappy, or times that we need to persevere and work hard. In any case, it’s important to understand where we’re at and focus knowing that soon we’ll be in another season soon. Sometimes our growth is like the nature and earth around us, absorbing what’s being given to us and creating life and action out of the energy. Sometimes we grow up how we want to and sometimes we have to twist and turn in ways we didn’t imagine we’d have to. But either way, we must be aware of the direction we’re trying to go and hopefully that is influenced by the Buddhist path. So I hope this Hinamatsuri, if you celebrate it, we enjoy the festivities and look at ourselves and how far we’ve come and keep our eye on the future and our potential to grow even more!

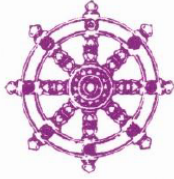

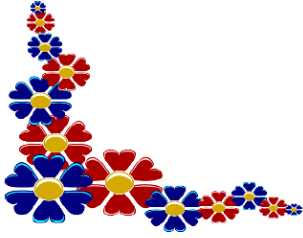

You are encouraged to **apply** for the Buddhist Church of Florin's Kikuyo and Kinjiro Nakatani (Nakatani) Scholarships, if you meet the following criteria:

\$5,000 Scholarship, \$3,000 Scholarship and \$2,000 Scholarship for Graduating High School Students

- Must be graduating from high school this academic year;
- Plan to attend an accredited university, college or vocational school full time next year;
- Your parent is a member of the Buddhist Church of Florin (church membership dues are paid and current before the scholarship application deadline); and
- You have been a Florin Dharma School student while attending high school.

Applicants will be judged on:

- Active participation in the Florin Dharma School
- Active participation in church program activities
- Active participation in community programs
- Academic achievements
- Essay (approximately 300 words) on the topic of how Buddhism affects your life
- In-person interview

\$5,000 Scholarship, \$3,000 Scholarship, \$2,000 Scholarship and \$1,000 Scholarship for Students Attending a University, College or Vocational School

- Must be attending an accredited university, college or vocational school full time this academic year and plan to continue next year full time and for the full year;
- You or your parent is a member of the Buddhist Church of Florin (church membership dues are paid and current before the scholarship application deadline);
- You have been participating in a Jodo Shinshu Buddhist church or program activities; and
- You have been a Florin Dharma School student while attending high school.
- To provide scholarship opportunities for more students, a university, college or vocational school student can be a recipient of only two Nakatani Scholarships while attending a university, college or vocational school.

Applicants will be judged on:

- Active participation in a Jodo Shinshu Buddhist church and/or program activities
- Active participation in community programs
- Academic achievements
- Essay (approximately 400 words) on the topic of how Buddhism affects your life
- In-person interview

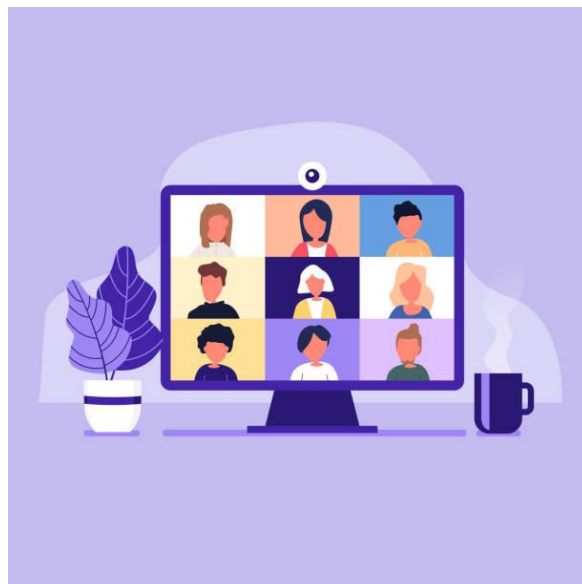
