[The sunset Shinran Shonin saw]



Hi everyone, welcome to March, the month we have an Ohigan service. Ohigan can be translated to mean the other shore, or the land of Buddha. The land of Buddha is said to exist in the west. Since the sun sets in the west, people would imagine the Pure Land by watching the sunset. It is said that the Pure Land is far beyond the western universe. On earth, we can recognize directions such as west or east. But in the universe, it is difficult to know directions. So, even if the Buddha tells us where the land of Buddha is located, it is hard to imagine. Because like the universe, it is hard to tell the direction. For example, when someone calls the church and says, "I'm trying to get to church, but I'm lost. How can I get there?", I would ask him, "Ok, where are you now?" Because if I know his current location, I can tell him which direction he should go.

The same is true for direction to the Pure Land. First of all, Buddha is trying to illuminate us, to show the true nature of humans. We all have a limited lifetime and it is hard to accept because of attachments. Because of the contradiction between truth and attachment, human beings create their own suffering. When we are illuminated by the light of Amida Buddha, our own being becomes clear. At the same time, we realize that Amida Buddha is pointing us in the direction we should follow. Knowing the destination of our lives may change how we spend our lives. Buddhism tells us to go beyond birth and death as a way to live our unrepeatable life without regrets.

Buddhism says humans have repeated "birth and death" in the six suffering worlds. Human life is still in this circle of the six worlds, and this is our current location. If we didn't encounter Amida Buddha's vow, we wouldn't be able to get out of this loop. There are many kinds of paths to reach enlightenment. But the path that Amida Buddha shows us is a path where you can walk with peace of mind. If the road is too tough, where you are expected to not get lost or go wrong, it is very hard to walk and difficult to continue. Amida Buddha knows that humans are not perfect, and says, "You can make a mistake. Don't worry, even if you get lost, I will definitely take you to the Pure Land." This is the path that Nembutsu followers walk. Instead of "how can I get to Amida Buddha," Jodo Shinshu followers understand that "Amida Buddha is thinking about how to bring us." I would like to recite the Nembutsu during the Ohigan season, thinking that Shinran Shonin also saw the setting sun and imagined the Pure Land.

Spring Ohigan (Equinox) Service

In the Spring and Fall, Jodo Shinshu Buddhists gather to welcome in the new season twice a year. The celebration is called Ohigan which literally means the Other Shore. Ohigan or the Spring Equinox is when we can see and feel the harmony in the world around us. The sun rises directly from the East and sets directly in the West. The length of day and night are equal and the weather tends to be very mild. This is when conditions are right for the practice of selfless sharing, discipline, diligence, patience loving kindness and wisdom.

As Jodo Shinshu Buddhists, it is a time for deep self-reflection on all that we have received from others as well as the world. It is a time to reflect on our imperfect self and be reminded that we have already received the mind of true entrusting. Therefore, we gather before the sacred shrine of Amida Buddha and meditate on the harmony of nature and devote ourselves to the realization of this harmony in our inner lives.

Rennyō Shonin Memorial



Rennyō Shōnin is considered the “second founder” of Jōdo Shinshū Buddhism even though he shaped foremost how Shinshū is practiced today. Moreover, living in a turbulent era of civil unrest, religious persecution, and social upheaval, he literally saved the Honganji temple from the flames of war and conflict.

Today, the “how” and “where” Shinshū is practiced is thanks largely to Rennyō. Our temples exist because of the organizational foundation he laid 600 years ago. He started the tradition of chanting “Shoshinge,” Shinran’s verses summarizing Pure Land teachings. He stressed the importance of Hoonko services (Shinran’s memorial). His letter “White Ashes” is traditionally read at funerals and memorials. We recite “Namu Amida Butsu” because Rennyō chose the six-character phrase over other Nembutsu expressions used by Shinran.

Rennyō passed away at age 85. At some Higashi Honganji temples, Rennyō’s memorial service is held monthly on the 25th day. His image on a scroll hangs on the left side of the altar. On the right side of the altar is Shinran’s image.

Rennyō fought to preserve and strengthen the temple organization because he felt it was the best place for hearing Shinran’s teachings, for coming together as a Sangha, for realizing a sense of shared spirituality, and for deepening one’s faith. We give thanks to Rennyō for the existence of our temples today.

Buddhist Church of Florin Governing Board Meeting Highlights February 9, 2023

1. A Special Scheduled Service will be held on Sunday, February 26, 2023. BCA Eitaikyo Memorial Service will be shown virtually at 10 am (Rev Imada will share the service live on YouTube). Immediately following the BCA

Eitaikyo Memorial Service will be BCF February Shotsuki & Nirvana Day Service.

2. On October 8, the BCA Northern California ministers will hold a service at the Sacramento Betsuin for the joint celebration of the 850th anniversary of the birth of Shinran Shonin and the 800th anniversary of the establishment of Jodo Shinshu Buddhism. Since this service conflicts with the BCF Shotsuki service, the Board agreed to move the Shotsuki service to the 3rd Sunday of October. Rev. Imada will check if our members can attend the joint service in person at the Betsuin. Arrangements will also be made to view the live stream in the BCF Hondo.
3. The General Meeting was held on January 22 following the service. It was called to order by Eric Fujii at 11:10 am followed by gassho led by Rev. Imada. Eric gave a summary of the year, including information about temple reopening and upcoming projects. The Treasurer's Report and the proposed budget for 2023 were presented. A motion to approve the proposed budget was passed. There was no further business, and the meeting was adjourned at 11:24 am
4. Super Bowl Food Bazaar on February 12 is scheduled to served up to 426 chicken plates, 225 curry rice bowls and 283 udon bowls. Thank you to all the hardworking volunteers!

8. New temple re-opening guidelines were accepted by the Board and go into effect March 1. Temple and facilities use are returning to pre-COVID conditions except that masks are highly recommended indoors and are required during food preparation. Cleaning and disinfection guidelines were updated.
9. The BCA Music Committee is having a gatha writing contest as part of the BCA 125th anniversary. There are two divisions (adults and children). Participants must write at least 2 stanzas and the entry is due June 1. Cash prizes will be awarded. Professional musicians will write the music to the lyrics chosen.
10. Obon Odori will be July 8 at 7 pm. The Hatsubon service will be at 3 pm and in between there will be cultural events such as kendo and kyudo kai (Japanese archery) demonstrations. Committees are forming. To volunteer contact Walter Menda (wmenda@pacbell.net). Please be generous with your time. This will be the first Obon Festival in three years!
11. The Board thanks Burt Yoshioka for his generous donation to replace the multipurpose room and hallway blinds.

Interesting facts regarding the BBT, JSC and UCB:

Berkeley Buddhist Temple

BBT was founded over a 100 years ago by Issei pioneers from Japan and is affiliated with the Buddhist Churches of America (BCA). Though today they still enjoy the ethnic traditions the founders brought with them, they are experiencing the exciting beginnings of broadening their base to include a multi-culturalism that enhances and deepens their understanding of Jodo Shinshu Buddhism. Buddhist Church of Florin's (BCF) connections to BBT include three of our former ministers, Rev. Newton Ishiura and Rev. Candice Shibata, who also served as resident ministers at BBT; and Rev. Ryo Imamura, who grew up at BBT when his father was the resident minister there. Bradley Menda, alumni of BCF Dharma School/YBA, is President of BBT's Board of Directors. Additionally, Rev. Matt Hamasaki was a Minister Assistant at BBT before his assignment at the Sacramento Betsuin.

Jodo Shinshu Center

JSC opened in 2006 through the vision to create a 21st century home for Buddhist education in America. JSC houses a growing campus of scholarship, education, outreach, and events that includes the Institute of Buddhist Studies, Center for Buddhist Education, Jodo Shinshu International Office, Ryukoku University Berkeley Center, and BCA Bookstore. JSC has conference facilities and dormitories to host national and local seminars and activities throughout the year. Madeline Kubo, alumni of BCF Dharma School/YBA, is the BCA Bookstore Manager and Program Assistant at the Jodo Shinshu International Office. The JSC occupies a former car dealership building once owned by Reggie Jackson, Baseball Hall of Famer and Oakland A's player.

\$5,000 Scholarship and \$3,000 Scholarship for Graduating High School Students

- Must be graduating from high school this academic year;
- Plan to attend an accredited university, college or vocational school full time next year;
- Your parent is a member of the Buddhist Church of Florin (church membership dues are paid and current before the scholarship application deadline); and
- You have been a Florin Dharma School student while attending high school.

Applicants will be judged on:

- Participation in the Florin Dharma School
- Participation in church program activities
- Participation in community programs
- Academic achievements
- Essay (approximately 300 words) on the topic of how Buddhism affects your life
- In-person interview

\$5,000 Scholarship, \$3,000 Scholarship, \$2,000 Scholarship and \$1,000 Scholarship for Students Attending a University, College or Vocational School

- Must be attending an accredited university, college or vocational school full time this academic year and plan to continue next year full time and for the full year;
- You or your parent is a member of the Buddhist Church of Florin (church membership dues are paid and current before the scholarship application deadline); and
- You have been a Florin Dharma School student while attending high school.
- To provide scholarship opportunities for more students, a university, college or vocational school student can be a recipient of only two Nakatani Scholarships while attending a university, college or vocational school.

Applicants will be judged on:

- Essay (approximately 400 words) on the topic of how Buddhism affects your life
